### **Membership and Class Fees**

At the Executive Meeting August 21, 2006 the Executive held a review of 2006-2007 membership and class fees. There will be no increase in membership fees this year (remain \$30 adult / \$20 youth 16-25). With input from the Teacher's Rep, the class schedule was also discussed. Traditionally the second session of classes is 12 weeks which would bring us to the end of March in 2007. Feedback from members and teachers in the past has been that early class endings makes a long stretch without VISCDS activities / dancing before two significant events in our calendar year; namely the AGM and our Spring Fling Social. It was decided this year we would extend our 2nd session of classes into the week of April 16<sup>th</sup>, culminating with the AGM on April 19, 2007. If the AGM date needs to change, the week of April 16<sup>th</sup> will remain our last week of classes. To defray the room rental costs and teachers' honoraria for these additional classes, there will be a small increase in fees for classes this year (see the enclosed membership form for further details).

Your newsletter will be delivered to the class in which you register. If you are absent your class rep will keep your Fling for the two classes after initial delivery, and then will mail it to you. If you are not going to be in town, please call your rep and let him/her know.
