PROPOSAL FOR VISCDS CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES

We would also request any comments or concerns to be forwarded in writing to the Executive for further consideration at a future Executive meeting.

"EXTRACT FROM DIRECTORS MINUTES"

At a duly convened meeting of the Directors of the Vancouver Island Scottish Country Dance Society held Thursday April 6, 2006 proposals were advanced pertaining to potential amendments to the Constitution of the Society. After discussion by the Directors it was M/S/C that several items of proposed change be brought under consideration by the report of the Directors to the Annual General Meeting. The items for consideration are:

- A. That a General Meeting of the Members be called in the Fall of 2006 to consider and vote upon each of the following individual alterations, additions and deletions to the Constitution of the Society:
 - [1] Amending Article 25.(2) by changing the words to;

"No person may serve as a director for more than four consecutive years"

from; "No person may hold office for more than three consecutive years.

- [2] Deleting Article 25.(5) in its entirety "If no successor is elected the person previously elected or appointed continues to hold office"
- [3] Article 31.(5) to be amended by deleting the word "shall" and substituting in its place the word "may".
- [4] Amending Article 30.(2) "No Instructors actively teaching Scottish country dancing in Vancouver Island Scottish Country Dancing Society may be elected as Directors"
- B. That the members discuss the changes brought forward and that any comments, observations and opinions of the members be transcribed and delivered to the Directors for their further consideration.

30th ANNUAL WORKSHOP AND BALL WEEKEND

At the Saturday morning workshops there were 19 dancers in Level 1, 34 in Level II and 67 in Level III. The afternoon classes offered choices of Music and the Dance with 36 participants, Quadrilles 47, step 15 and 25 for the Ball walkthrough. The evening Ball was attended by 135 dancers and 6 non-dancers. Of the 204 participants in the weekend, 81 were VISCDS members with 49 attending the Ball.

The very popular Sunday Social and Brunch saw 135 weary but still happy dancers and the weekend was topped off with an amazing concert in the afternoon with Muriel Johnstone and Keith Smith winding us down with their wonderful music.

This year's offering of shirts to commemorate the 30th year of this event brought in 93 orders.

Our teachers were David Queen from England, Gary Thomas from California and Mary Murray from Vancouver. Our musicians were Muriel Johnstone, now from Courtenay and Keith Smith from England. All of these talented people worked well together to give us a most enjoyable weekend.

Thanks go to Rob Robinson for sponsoring us in the use of the Ward Room and to Jim Scott for his sponsorship in the use of the CPO's Mess. Thanks also to the volunteers who helped to decorate, undecorate and to greet the guests.

All but one of this year's committee is retiring. Some have served for several Workshop and Ball Weekends and in Mike Hanna's words have been "recycled" several times. I have had the pleasure of working with this dedicated committee for the past four years and I would like to thank them for their support and for their untiring efforts to put together such a successful and popular event. The committee is set up in such a way that each member has a specific task and progress reports are discussed at five to six meetings from October to March. I would urge newer members to answer Lesley Brennand's call for volunteers to attend an information meeting to set up a new committee for the 2007 Workshop and Ball Weekend.
