#### Over the Hills and Far Away

(Thoughts about Scotland # 1)

#### **Scottish Radio**

In these days of on-line broadcasts it's easy enough to listen to something like BBC Radio Scotland if you have a computer, and if you're interested. Apart from up-to-date news about what's going on over there, BBC Scotland has excellent radio drama, folk & classical music, and public affairs programmes from the Outer Hebrides to the Scottish Borders. If you'd like to access the whole BBC pantheon, including Gaelic & Welsh language programmes—about 57 BBC radio stations in all—try <a href="http://www.bbc.co.uk/radio/aod/mainframe.shtml">http://www.bbc.co.uk/radio/aod/mainframe.shtml</a> . There you can also select programmes by genre (type of music, drama, children's, comedy & quizzes, history, etc.)

#### Literature

If you're interested in Scottish stories/histories you'll have to go a long way to find better reading than Nigel Tranter's stories. Tranter was a fine novelist, and contemporary historians have paid tribute to the accuracy of his research. His recreations of the people and events that have characterised Scotland's story over the centuries animate the breadth and depth of Scotland's history—from the Lords of the Isles to William Wallace and Robert the Bruce, through his superb trilogy on Montrose's life and campaigns, and on down through Scotland's kings.

Tranter passed away at his home in Aberlady (just south of Edinburgh) in 2000. He's justly known as Scotland's greatest 20<sup>th</sup> century historical novelist. His books should be available in most bookstores, and certainly from electronic outlets like (the Victoria-based) <a href="https://www.abebooks.com">www.abebooks.com</a> or from <a href="https://www.abebooks.com">www.abebooks.

#### **Travel Tips**

Flights: Air Canada, Air Transat and Zoom all fly direct from Vancouver to Glasgow. I find that Air Transat usually has the best fares—but since you then have to make your own way to Vancouver International there are added costs. With the Victoria-Vancouver hop factored in, Air Canada sometimes has competitive prices. Remember though that there are more western Canada-UK airline seats than passengers at the moment and thus some excellent fare deals.

I usually spend a couple of hours doing my flight research on line, and then pass the information along to my travel agent and ask her if she can improve on it. She can usually affect some further savings, and she appreciates that fact that I've done some of the leg work first.

- 25-32 1<sup>st</sup> Cpl dnc reels of 4 with 1<sup>st</sup> cnr, pass ptnr LS to end in 2<sup>nd</sup> plc facing out to start next sequence
