INTERMEDIATE CLASS (starts September 11)

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2007/08

The 2007/08 executive has worked effectively and efficiently throughout the past year. Although we were without a President for the first six months, all executive members contributed their time, expertise and experience in order to carry out their respective duties well to ensure a successful year.

In the summer of 2007 we addressed the issue of declining membership in the past few years, resulting in low participation in some classes and less money coming in. With positive feedback from our Treasurer concerning our financial state, it was decided that we would not raise membership or class fees, nor amalgamate any classes for the coming year.

Both Open Houses attracted approximately 16 new participants in total, with six of those becoming full members. Once again, we need to find ways of attracting and keeping more members.

In the fall term 12 classes were scheduled for all class levels and 14 each were held in the spring. With membership numbers dropping, class and membership fees do not cover the expense of hall rentals and teachers. Last summer Jamie Orr, our Treasurer, again applied for and was successful in obtaining a Lottery Grant of \$2,000 for our Society and this supplements our revenue for class fees.

This year's socials ran smoothly and were well attended thanks to the dedication and talents of many volunteers organizing each event. The joint Christmas dance was hosted by our Society and 110 guests enjoyed a fabulous evening of dancing, delectable nibblies and a lantern-lit performance from our demo team. The Robbie Burns celebration was a wonderful evening honoring the Bard and was again a joint event with the Branch coordinating a delicious Pot Luck dinner and speakers, and our Society organizing the dance/snack portion of the evening. This event attracted a very full hall of nine sets of dancers who enjoyed a lively program put together by Bob Anderson. Our March Ball and Workshop weekend, coordinated by Lesley Brennand, was also a great success judging from the very positive feedback received from many attendees.

This month the executive's final project was to sponsor a Survey which was compiled and administered by an executive committee. Thank you to all those who kindly took the time to complete and return them. From the results of this survey, the executive have considered the members' responses in planning for the next dancing year.

In closing, I wish to thank the executive for their advice and assistance throughout the year. You've all done a tremendous job and I appreciate each of you for your strengths and commitment to our Society.

I hope you noticed the decorations and the tables looked lovely with new runners and floral arrangements made by Joan McIntosh and her group. Unfortunately, due to other commitments our team is breaking up. We are in need of a Coordinator, Ceilidh Chair and Catering Chair persons. We have set the date for next year and have booked the Ward Room and PO's Mess for March 2009.
