Two Dances for the Spring Fling

Most of the dances for the April Social are in the core book but the following two are not and are less familiar.

Dancing Dolphins

A 32 Bar Jig for 3 couples in a 4 couple set

	A 32 But sig for 3 couples in a 4 couple set
Bars 1-8	1C cross RH and cast off one place, 2C step up on bars 3-4. 1C turn LH $1\frac{1}{4}$ times to finish facing the lady's side, man with his partner on his right.
9-16	1C dance a tandem (dolphin) reel with 2L and 3L giving RSh to 3L.
17-24	1C dance a tandem (dolphin) reel with 2M and 3M giving LSh to 3M.
25-32	1C in promenade hold dance out between 2L and 3L and down around 3L. 1C dance up the middle, drop hands and cast off on their own side around 2C and finish in second place.

Repeat having passed a couple.

Note: The tandem reels are full eight bar reels but are similar to Pelorus Jack in that dancing couple change lead position each time they curve around at the end of the reel.

The Celtic Cross

A 32 Bar Strathspey for 4 couples in a square formation

Bars 1-2	All set advancing to partners passing LSh and ending back to back.
3-4	All turn the person they are now facing 2H ending facing partner.
5-6	All set advancing to partners passing LSh and ending back to back.
7-8	All turn the person they are now facing 2H ending ladies in original positions and men in the centre facing partners.
9-16	"THE SQUARE KNOT" 9-10 All turn partner RH ½ turn into allemande hold facing clockwise (ladies on inside, men on outside). 11-12 Advance one position clockwise 13-16 Drop RH, ladies dance in front of their partner and turn LH to finish one position CW from original place.

- 17-20 Side couples (1C & 3C now in side positions) dance into the centre passing the person opposite RSh, pulling back RSh and dancing RH across halfway.
- 21-24 1L followed by 1M dance between couple in 3rd place and chase to their left (counter clockwise) to 2nd place.

 3rd couple dance similarly passing between the couple in 1st place.
- 25-32 Grand Chain (one bar per hand)

Repeat from new positions.
