The videos may be helpful but range from quite good to terrible (bad sound, poor dance technique, variations from the actual dance directions, etc.).

Greetings from Howard Hospital, Zimbabwe.

Thank you from all the children here that you are helping from all of your generosity and kindness. Proceeds from the dance will buy goats for orphans and Lovemore has made a good start on this, he also has three male goats for the patient's Christmas stew. VIDEA donations are used only for education and we hope to finish paying school fees for 2012 for approximately 45 children. Donations from relatives and other friends are being used to assist three pre-schools. One is a church that will

get a cement floor (to replace dirt) and windows and will be given rent-free as a pre-school. The work will be done by the community.

WE will also get some toys and books since there is absolutely nothing in the school.

Paul, Pedrinah and the boys are well. Paul works non-stop as always.

It is very HOT, apparently breaking records, over 40 in the north and feels like it here. It has been very busy at work, but is quiet this weekend. I am taking care of the male ward again, twenty-six beds. One morning there were nine floor beds. There are so many young people dying of AIDS and many come into the hospital too ill to recover. There are many cases of TB with positive sputum.

The impression I have so far is not one of improvement, even though statistics say otherwise.

To the gardeners, my little garden has been neglected for many months, but now the gardenia is a mass of blooms that wilt in the heat. The bouganvillia is double and a mass of blooms. The lime tree has a lot of fruit, the mango tree (rescued from a garbage pit) is now twelve feet high and has fruit.

Albert really enjoys the dancing on Sunday, and had us all out there yesterday in the heat. Everyone had a great time and there was a lot of laughing. One mother had a baby on her back and it didn't seem to mind being bumped up and down. Also there was a twelve year old boy who looked about seven starting on treatment. His ambuya (granny) was with him and they both danced. Elizabeth is eighteen and looks twelve. She comes every Sunday. The treat is now a bun with jam, and some candies.

Someone asked me about how I coped with the sadness here, it is very difficult at times. Lovemore found a little girl of fourteen, an orphan. Her grandmother had three orphans. She sent this girl away because she couldn't feed her. The little girl did get to another grandparent and Lovemore has her on our list for school fees. How do we cope? I try to be helpful and do as much as possible with what is available. I have always found it difficult to deal with ill children. One wonders what their lives will be like, even if they start on ART.

There is a lovely nurse from Winnipeg for the third time. She is a great friend and even gets up to do rounds on the male ward at 6 am. There is also a lovely social worker from Toronto who will be here until late January.

My 'house' is quite comfortable and Lovemore always gets me a fan which I appreciate.

My happiest times are on his motourbike. The countryside is beautiful and we are planning to go on another trip soon to see the church and visit schools to assess school fees.

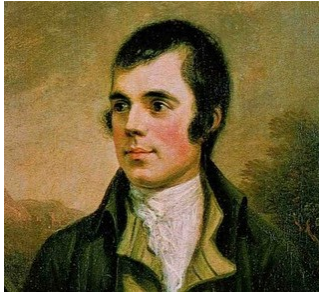
