Presidents Corner January 2012

Under the leadership of our ever resourceful Jenny Laing, the intermediate class did a wonderful job of hosting the Joint Christmas Social on December 10th. Joan Axford and Anita Mathers called the dances and we were delighted to have accordionist Mary Ross providing the music and improvising as she went along to add a Christmas touch to the tunes. We also had a delightful performance from the demonstration team who surprised Joan Axford with a program designed to honour her.

As we move forward into the New Year, it is also a time to review the events and accomplishments of the past year. 2011 was an especially challenging year as we struggled with locating and adapting to new venues for our classes after the closure of the St Martin in the Fields Church. Our classes moved to five new locations, the Eastern Star Lodge, Esquimalt United Church, St. Paul's Anglican Church, All Saints Anglican Church and the James Bay Athletic Association.

Fortunately in September we were able to relocate two of our classes to the Hall at Saint Martin's as the Anglican Diocese of B.C. had not yet sold the building. In November we received word that the Church was being sold to the Victoria Full Gospel Fellowship Church. Not long after hearing this news, I received a call from the Pastor of the Church, Stewart Mackenzie, asking if we wished to continue to rent the church hall and by the end of the month we had booked all our winter classes at the newly named Victoria Full Gospel Fellowship (VFGF) Church. Home at last! Current membership is ninety-five, down from one hundred and seven members last year at this time. Between January and December 2011 nineteen new dancers joined the club, twelve of whom joined us in the fall. Although the membership numbers are down, the current members participate much more extensively in classes and socials than those in former years as many of those who did not renew this year were no longer active dancers.

We have carried out a number of successful recruitment events over the past year. In February we hosted a highly successful and well attended Ceilidh as part of the Dance Days celebrations. This event raised our profile in the community and although late in the dance season, three new dancers joined us that February. In May and June we offered a series of six basic level classes which were attended by eight newcomers, one of whom joined the club in the

fall. Our second Ceilidh on August 20th was also well attended and brought in another six newcomers. This event was followed by a September Open House and by the end of October we had five more new members.

We have a busy season ahead. Classes start on Tuesday January 3rd and the following **Tuesday**, **January 10th**, we will be holding our **Open House**. Please bring friends and acquaintances who may be interested in Scottish Country Dancing.

On **January 21st**, **Mary Ross** will be playing for our **Burns Social** at Les Passmore. This year's Burns night includes the "Address to the Haggis" and a silent auction so get your items to Maureen Orr as early in January as you can and/or let her know what food or drink items you can contribute.

Don't miss the highlight of our Social Season with the **March 31st Spring Social and Workshops!** Read all about our workshop teacher Louise McGillivray and our guest musicians, Brian Crisafulli and Guinevere Saenger on page 6 of the Fling.

"Let's Have a Ceilidh"

On **Friday, February 3rd** we are once again hosting a **Dance Days Ceilidh** at the Dance Victoria Studios. Our program is still in the planning stages but expect performances by the demonstration team, Gaelic singer, Margaret Chapman, our favorite Highland fiddler Gavin Duncan accompanied by guitarist Ian Johnston, and if our invitation is accepted the Highland and Irish dancers and one or more bagpipers. Live music provided by the Elastic Ceilidh Band and Gavin Duncan and Ian Johnston.

The Branch will also be hosting an afternoon Tea Dance now moved to Saturday February 18th at the VFGF Church on Obed.

Greetings from Howard Hospital, Zimbabwe.

Dear friends, rain at last so seeding has started. This has been the hottest weather on record since 1962.

First a summary of the completed projects from your donations and again thank you from all of those here that you help. I aways emphasize all donors are friends in Canada and I do appreciate you allowing me to be the messenger.

- DANCE 30 goats for needy children many of which are orphans (includes rope and petro)
- VIDEA school fees paid for 68 children for 2012

-Other donations - paint and curtains for the Tariro Clinic

- funding for four preschools (mentioned in last newsletter)
- three male goats for christmas stew for the patients We teased Lovemore and told him that he had to carry them live on his motorbike. With helmets on them of course. One is already in the hospital freezer.

The hospital continues to be very busy with patients from all over Zimbabwe. I believe they come because of Paul's reputation. My days start early, at 6 a.m. on the male ward. Always AIDS, TB, Meningitis, etc. Some very sad and also some happy endings.

The most relaxing and happy times I have had here are on the motor bike with Lovemore. So I will describe a day in mid-November. We left at 8 a.m. on a very hot day. The country is very beautiful with rock outcrops and very small farms. We always meet several people that Lovemeore knows so we stop to say hello. First we went to Musararara Primary and Secondary Schools to pay school fees. Both headmasters are very kind and caring. They for a stop at Lovemore's Pastor's home where we shared our muffins and had a water break. Then on again to Maori Primary School located in a very poor dry area. The school buildings are dilapitated and there are may children attending. Manyara was there as several children from her orphanage attend that school. Manyara is a beautiful, kind lady who started Godknows Orphanage. The orphans are in three villages with caregivers. The orphanage is trying to become self-supporting.

Next on the bumpiest road I have ever been on. I was surprised later to find out that I was still the same height. Lovemore could not find a smooth track. Then on to another poor school. Lovemore remembered it as a beautiful, well kept farm. Lovemore admonished the staff for their neglect. While there we watched the harvesting of sugar beans. Long stock are flayed on the ground. Next was a stop in the shade of a tree for some water. Then on a less bumpy road (all roads are dirt) to Gweshe Village. By this time Lovemore was hungry so we visited Itai, a young woman I have know for years. She has a little food outlet and tries to make enough to pay for her treatment for cancer (a type that occurs with AIDS). She wept and then we both wept when I handed her the twenty dollars donated by a dear friend in Victoria. The cost of her treatment is eighty dollars a month and she had had to miss last month's treatment because she didn't have enough money. How can we help this brave woman? We arrived home in the late afternoon, hot dusty and thirsty but very satisfied.

Another memorable day was to an estate in Harare owned by a business man, a member of the church of LDS (Mormon). Several acres with a swimming pool and tennis court. Plus several containers full of medical and school supplies mainly from the USA. He has 6 daughters and all are involved in charitable work. They loaded our truck with

supplies for the hospital and at my request they gave us much stuff for four very needy pre-schools. When school opens in January there will be lots of toys and books for the young children. These donations come because of the respect that this gentleman has for Paul. Dancing continues every Sunday morning. Albert loves to teach and we always have lots of laughs. We have not progressed beyond the African version of Corn Riggs but we always have lots of clapping and laughter. Christmas is very quiet here and I will help in the morning to take a little present to each patient. We usually have dinner with Paul and Pedrinah and make rounds as usual. This will not reach you before Christmas but I hope that you all have had a happy holiday and best wishes for the new year.
