## Dance Days Ceilidh - February 3, 2012

Dance Victoria Studio's on Quadra Street was the venue for the "Let's Have a Ceilidh" evening of Scottish country dancing. From beginners, to performances by the skilled demonstration team, Irish dancers, Gaelic singing, Highland fiddling, Scottish small pipes and the Great Highland pipes - everything connected with a good Ceilidh was part of the program.



Over 130 attended, including Japanese tourists (who could not speak English but understood how to do a nice cross by the right), students from UVic and Camosun College (one student from distant Uruguay and one from Columbia), members from the English country dancing group, some past SCD members, and also SCD members with their families, friends and neighbors. The purpose of having the Ceilidh (being to expose Scottish country dancing to the community) was given a nice boost.

The Elastic Ceilidh Band set the mood for the evening with lively tunes to get everyone's toes tapping. Joined by Ian Johnston from the Celtic Band "Rig a Jig" on guitar and renowned Scottish fiddle player Gavin Duncan the evening got

off to a great start.

Our Master of Ceremonies, Dora Dempster welcomed our guests and gave them an introduction to Scottish Country Dancing in Victoria. Bob Anderson began the evenings instruction with round the room dances. A real challenge when you have a hall full of mostly beginner dancers. Nice work Bob.

First break saw Ceilidh Acts begin with dancers from the Victoria School of Irish Dance. An amazing high energy, high stepping performance by the dancers. Margaret Chapman from the Victoria Gaelic Choir accompanied by Jamie Orr on the Scottish small pipes, sang the Gaelic love song "Gailin mo Ruinsa (Dearest my own one) and a traditional Scottish tune - Morag A Dunvegan" A group of experienced dancers then took the floor to demonstrate the dance "Belle of Bon Accord". They received a well deserved applause for a fine performance.

Back to dancing, with the Kingston Flyer briefed by Bob Anderson. Bob added a bit of a philosophical note expressing his friendly desire to help dancers achieve relief from pain and suffering. In case you missed it here's a quick recap:

These were well received by the dancers, including the beginners.

At the final break, Dem team members Gordon Robinson, Pattie Whitehouse and Michelle Campbell were lead out to floor by Bob and Bonnie on the Great Highland Pipes. The first number was a Shepherds Crook followed by a Gay Gordon's Medley. A fine performance before the final set of dances.
