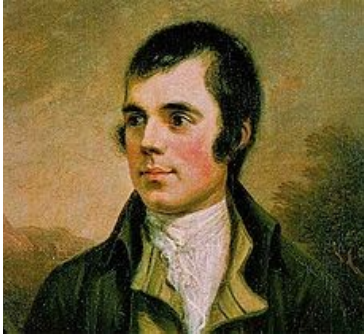
The Tartan Players,

It was two years ago that I last saw Art on a vacation trip to Nova Scotia with my sister. We stayed with him before continuing on our travels. In the evenings we reminisced about his time and the people he knew on the west coast but after driving and exploring with him to see his part of the world I could understand why he enjoyed the countryside out there. Art was a man of the land; it spoke to him, which is why his chosen career path was geology.

So now I say my final goodbye to my friend, it was a pleasure to dance with you over the years, and a privilege to know you for even longer.
