#### Handle with Care

Several of our members suffer from arthritis and other painful conditions in their hands. Unfortunately, some of their fellow dancers are a bit heavy-handed when giving hands. Giving "a firm grip" doesn't mean "squeeze the life out of the other person's hand". A limp hand is useless, however, so a "gently firm" grip is necessary. Most of the strength when giving hands should come from the upper arm. Another very painful – and dangerous – fault is giving a hand at shoulder height and then yanking the other person's arm sharply downward. Hands should be given at shoulder height of the shorter person and kept there throughout the figure (turns, hands round, rights and lefts, etc).

The dances below appear on the Spring Fling program. Here is some background information.

**Currie Mountain** is an extinct volcano near Fredericton NB. It is owned by the University of New Brunswick and is used for geology and forestry field trips as well as hiking and mountain biking. It is open to the public. The dance was devised by Mary Pugh and is from the New Brunswick Collection. See <a href="http://www.geocaching.com/">http://www.geocaching.com/</a>.

**Netherby Hall** is near Longtown, Cumbria, and is the seat of the Clan Graham. Parts of the hall date back to the 14th Century. It is the setting for Sir Walter Scott's poem, "Young Lochinvar". The dance was devised by John Drewry and is from the Bon Accord Book. The first sixteen bars of the dance illustrate the story of the poem. **12 Coates Crescent** is the address in Edinburgh of the Royal Scottish Country Dance Society. The dance was devised by the Publications and Research Committee in 1998 and is from the RSCDS Book 40. The postal code, EH3 7AF, is the name of another dance.
