FORMATIONS OF THE MONTH Monica Roots

"Corners Pass And Turn" As Devised By John Drewry

This figure takes 4 bars of music.

At commencement of this movement 1st Cpl are facing their own 1st corners.

Bars

- 1st Cpl dance out to the cnr position passing cnrs RS. 1
- 2 1st Cpl curve round to the right to face in.
- 3 1st Cpl dance in passing cnrs RS.
- 1st Cpl dance as instructed in the dance concerned. 4
- 1st Cnrs dance in passing 1M or 1L RS. 1
- 1st Cnrs turn one another RH once around. 2
- 1st Cnrs dance out to original cnr position, again passing 1M or 1L RS. 3
- 1st cnrs curve round by the R to starting positions.

Note from John Drewry.

It is important that the corners do not dally in the centre of the dance or they will be in the way of 1st Cpl i.e. corners must turn on the 2nd step and be dancing out on the 3rd step.

"Corners Pass and Turn" as in The Chequered Court, a jig for 3 Cpls on the 2003 Ball Program.

Bars

- 9-12 1st cnrs dance as above instructions – Bars 1-4.
- 9-10 1st Cpls dance as above Bars 1-2.
- 1st Cpls dance in passing cnrs RS, in a straight line up or down the middle of the set to meet and 11-12 pull RS back to finish back to back. They repeat bars 1-4 with 2nd cnrs dancing straight into centre through 2nd position to finish back to back, facing out to own side for double triangles.

Poussette in Strathspey Time

This formation is danced by two couples. Hands are joined with partner at shoulder height but held slightly wider than in the reel or jig poussette. The dance movements are long and sweeping and the hands are used to lead the steps.

Poussette Right Round

This is a non-progressive poussette which begins from the side lines.


8 setting steps. 8 bars of music.

1M and 2L begin with LEFT FOOT – This is the outside foot. Note: 1L and 2M begin with RIGHT FOOT – This is the outside foot.

Bars

- 1st and 2nd Cpls dance into a diagonal line to join hands with ptnrs. 1L and 2M dance into the
- middle back to back whilst 1M and 2L dance a small step with L foot. 1st Cpl dance diagonally out to the man's side, and 2nd Cpl to the ladies' side, both Cpls dancing a 2 1/4 turn by the R, on the hop.
- 1st Cpl dance diagonally down and into the middle, while 2nd Cpl dance diagonally up and into the 3 middle, 1M and 2L passing back to back.
- 1st and 2nd Cpls pulling with the RH, trn to form a diagonal line with 1st Cpl below 2nd Cpl, 1M and 4 2L are back to back in the middle.
- 1st and 2nd Cpls repeat bars 1 and 2, but 1st Cpl dance diagnally up and out to the ladies side, 2nd 5-6 Cpl down abnd out to the men's side. On bar 6 1L and 2M pass back to back.
- 1st and 2nd Cpls pulling with RH, turn to own side of the dance covering in the middle of the set.
- 1st and 2nd Cpls dance 1 step backward into original position.

Diagram



This formation is a method of progression. It begins with 1st and 2nd Cpls in a diagonal line, 1L and 2M back to back in the middle facing partner. 1st Cpl are nearer the man's side and 2nd Cpl nearer the ladies side of the dance.

4 setting steps. 4 bars of music.

1st Lady and 2nd Man begin with the LEFT FOOT 1st Man and 2nd Lady begin the RIGHT FOOT Note:

This is the outside foot.

Bars

- 1st Cpl dance diagonally out to the man's side and 2nd Cpl to the ladies side of the dance, both Cpls making a 1/4 turn by the R on the hop.
- 1st Cpl dance diagonally down and into the middle while 2nd Cpl dance diagonally up and into the 2 middle. 1M and 2L passing back to back.
- 1st and 2nd Cpls, pulling with RH, turn to own side of the set covering in the middle. 1st and 2nd Cpls dance one step backward to own side line, having changed places. 3

The Poussette Right Round is danced in bars 1-8 in The Village Reel, a dance on the Ball Program. The Half Poussette is dance twice in Neidpath Castle, bars 24-32, a dance on the Ceilidh Program.

BALL ETIQUETTE

A reminder.

- Dance etiquette is simply good manners.
- Sets are made up only after the dance is announced.
- Couples join the set at the end of the line.
- The gentleman at the top of the line counts off the required numbers of couples for each set and sees that the last set in the line is complete.
- The dance starts and ends with a Bow for the man and a curtsey by the lady, even when she is dancing
 on the man's side of the set.
- Excessive clapping and hooting during the dance is not considered appropriate.
- At the end of the dance it is courteous to thank the other dancers in the set for their helpful participation, and then the floor is cleared.
- If you are joining the Grand March at the beginning of the Ball Program, remember that your partner will also be your partner for the first dance on the program, as the final lines of eight at the end of the Grand March will be directed into four couple sets.

Kilt Etiquette - the art of sitting down decorously

The President, in the last Island Fling, in her letter about the care of the kilt made an observation (no pun intended) about the possible lack of decorum by gentlemen wearing a kilt. May I comment. Many Scottish Country Dancers start wearing a kilt when there is no-one 'around home' to teach them manners or to give them a tip or two about the kilt. If your kilt fits you properly it is easy to sit down decorously. Here is how. As you sit down spread your knees fairly wide and sit down with them spread. The front aprons (there are two) should fall between and below your knees. In case you don't feel secure, casually drop one hand between your knees as you sit down and push the aprons down.

A further tip: ordinary everyday cotton boxer shorts underwear comes in a variety of imitation tartans. You can easily get a fairly close match to your kilt, so if you inadvertently expose your underwear, there won't be a flash of white; it will blend in with your kilt. *Jamie MacKendrick*
