PITLOCHRY 2004

I have been approached by about ten dancers who have expressed interest in getting more information about the 2004 Winter school. News at present is sketchy, but I'll try to summarize the current situation. Please be aware that there are some assumptions in my calculations, particularly regarding air-travel costs.

As yet, the only information on the Winter School at Pitlochry is for the last (Feb 2003) School. The web site is www.rscds.org/events/Winter School If you have Adobe Acrobat 5 you can download the Application form as a pdf. For anyone without access to this programme, I can photocopy the details. Owing to the lack of information on next winter's proceedings (the deadline for registration for the 2003 event was 30 September 2002), I am writing from information received on the internet, supplemented handsomely by details from Walter Roots, to whom I owe a great deal for his thoughtfulness.

The School has been held since 2000 in mid to late February (2003 was held 20-25 Feb) and almost all the activities take place at the Atholl Palace Hotel in Pitlochry. Participants gather for dinner on the Thursday evening and stay through to breakfast on Tuesday morning. Walter indicates that this is a fine hotel, set in its own park, about 10 min walk from the centre of town. "It is well run, very comfortable and congenial and the food is excellent with

a menu of 5 or 6 choices at each meal".

The School is limited to about 140 participants. Classes at intermediate, advanced and very advanced (defined in the brochure on the web) are held in the mornings with optional dance-related activities from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. each afternoon. On Monday evening there is a Ball at Blair Castle, transport provided. Programmes for all the social evenings and the Ball are sent out in November. Dances are briefed, but not walked through. Membership of RSCDS is required to attend. Many of us will need to pay an extra \$30 (I think) to be members.

I am in contact with a travel agent to get details of fares. A group fare is for 12-15 people, but this is being confirmed. However, the group fare idea might not be the best way to approach this, since we would all be required to travel and return together. I know from speaking to many of those interested, that you want to stay in the UK for longer once you are there and others want to be back within a week. The Air Canada debacle has not helped, but there is likely to be a seat sale announced in the fall.

Walter and Monica paid about \$760 inclusive (each) with Air Canada/British Midland to fly Vancouver/Heathrow/Glasgo w return. I expect fares would be in the same ballpark or about 10% higher. The bus/ferry to Vancouver airport was \$32 and transport by bus to Pitlochry was about \$30 (roughly £12.50).

The Winter School (2003 rates) including dinner, bed and breakfast course fees, afternoon activities, transport to Blair Castle and Ball was £280, and lunches at the hotel ranged from £1.50 to £4.00 depending on choice. A deposit of £50 is required by Sept 30. Walter does not think this will increase greatly. Conversion to \$Cdn at say \$2.3 = £1, would have a cost for the school of \$690 for the heartiest eaters.

Assuming the same order of airfare and a minimal increase in school and hotel costs, the total for the trip would be about of the order of \$1750, but I believe it is necessary to stay out of the country for 7 days to get the lowest fare. For those going elsewhere this would not be a problem. For those staying only a week, two extra nights accommodation are required. There was accommodation at the hotel both before and after the school for £40 (~\$100) per person per night, again for dinner, bed and breakfast. This is a bargain compared to prices elsewhere. Thus for the week-long dancers the cost is about \$1950.
