COATS LAND (Jig)

Bars	Description
1-4	1st couple dance in slightly and cast off two places. 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} couples step up on bars $3 - 4$.
5-8	2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 1^{st} couples set to partners and, giving right hands, turn half way to finish in allemande hold all facing down.
9-16	1 st , 3 rd and 2 nd couples allemande. Order is now 1, 3, 2 all on opposite sides.
17-20	Contra chase: 1 st woman, followed by 3 rd and 2 nd women, cross straight over passing the men by the left and dance down own side. Similarly, 1 st man, followed by 3 rd and 2 nd men, cross over and dance down own side. Note – there is no interweaving.
21-24	1 st couple (now in 3 rd place) dance up the middle and cast off to second place on own sides. 3 rd couple step down on bars 23-24.
25-28	1 st woman dances right hands across with 2 nd couple while 1 st man dances right hands across with 3 rd couple. On bar 28, 1 st couple pass by the right.
29-32	1 st man dances left hands across with 2 nd couple while 1 st woman dances left hands across with 3 rd couple. 1 st couple finish in second place on own side. Repeat, having passed a couple.
