In Memoriam

It is regret that we announce the passing of *Bill Hamilton* of Edinburgh. Bill taught classes in the Edinburgh area for many years. He devised several dances; his best-known dance is 'Ian Powrie's Farewell to Auchterarder'. Sincere condolences go to his family.

It is with much sorrow that we announce the passing of *Louise Cooke*. Louise and her husband Iain moved to Victoria from Winnipeg in the mid-1970's. They belonged to and danced with both the Branch and Van Isle. Louise served on several positions with the Branch Executive. She was not a teacher but she knew as much about dancing as any teacher. She was forced to give up dancing when she developed severe pain in her knees. Our condolences go to her family.

Clutha – a passenger ferry service, which ran up and down the River Clyde in Glasgow, began in 1884 and continued until 1903. There was a total of twelve steamer boats, all named 'Clutha' (Gaelic for the River Clyde). The service was used by workers commuting to the docks and industries along the river. The dance is a hornpipe; it is from a publication dated around 1890.

Weather Cancellation Policy

Bridge of Nairn

Possibly refers to the Dulsie Bridge, which provides a crossing over the River Findhorn and the waterfall that tumbles below. It was constructed in 1755 and is one of the most spectacular bridges in Scotland. The dance is a strathspey and is originally from the Bremner Collection published in 1757.
