These sessions will start on Monday, May 30 and will go to July 25, from 7:30 – 9:30 pm, \$5.00 per night. The socials will start on Thursday, June 2 and will go to July 28, from 7:30 – 10:30 pm, \$10.00 per night. Tea, coffee and refreshments in accordance with the guidelines from the Provincial Health Office will be served (no sign-up sheets for refreshments). Both practice sessions and socials will be held at City Light Church Hall, 550 Obed Avenue. They are open to all levels of dancers, and all dances will be walked through. Full vaccination is mandatory; masks are advisable. The booklets with the programs will be available shortly. Please note that, for safety's sake, if the temperature outside is 30° C or higher, dancing will be cancelled for that evening. This applies to both the practice sessions and the socials.

Summer dancing started in 1989, when three couples – Peter and Irene Pabsdorf, Ian and Ethel Sutherland and Bob and Alice Anderson – decided that they would like to continue dancing during the summer, and they were certain that other dancers in the area would like the opportunity to join them.
