# **VISCDS Membership**

The Returning and New member forms on the VISCDS web site have been updated for 2022/23 with the fee schedule agreed to at the last Executive Meeting. Membership fees have not increased in over a decade. Returning members class fees were increased by \$2.00 to \$110.00 for the full year. Class fees for a half year are \$60.00 and youth classes are free.

Membership fees are \$30 for adults and \$20 for youth (16 - 25).

Returning members class fees are increased \$2 to \$110 for the full year. Class fees for a half year are \$60 and youth classes are free.

New members <u>class</u> fees are \$95 for the full year. Sept. to Dec. <u>class</u> fees are \$45, and Jan. to Apr. <u>class</u> fees are \$60.

Drop-In Punch cards are \$60 for ten classes.

#### **Teachers' Corner**

Last December it was decided to combine the Beyond Basic and Intermediate classes into one class due to the limited attendance. We still believe that there is a need for a Beyond Basic class for dancers who have learned the basics but have not been introduced to a number of the standard formations in intermediate level dances.

The teachers will be talking to dancers over the fall to determine the level of interest for another class at this level. If you feel you would be interested in such a class, please speak to your teacher. This would apply for those in the Basic Class as well as more experienced dancers who would appreciate a class that reviewed the common formations in more detail.

In general, as your dancing develops, please speak to your teacher at any time about whether you would be ready for a higher-level class. We always like to see dancers move to a new class or add an additional class (at no additional charge!) when they are ready for the next step.

Finally, as we start dancing for a new season, keep in mind that you have been away from dancing from several weeks or months. Even if you have been physically active and are in good shape, there will be muscles and joints that need a gentle reminder of what is involved in Scottish country dancing. Good warmups and a gradual start will help to avoid injuries and even just aches and pains.
