## Tips for Dancing at the Ball

#### The Grand March:

- The Grand March is often used to start off the ball. It is simply a march around the room with a partner, usually to the music of a piper. It is extremely easy no fancy footwork or formations and very suitable for normally non-dancing partners who may have attended the ball with you.
- The grand march leads directly into sets for the first dance, so you may want to look over that dance before the event.
- The leader(s) of the Grand March will direct you where to go once the music begins.

#### Finding a Partner:

- It is customary to dance with many different partners throughout the evening.
- Beginners shouldn't be afraid to ask more experienced dancers to dance.
- Experienced dancers are strongly encouraged to invite beginners to dance
- If asked to dance at a ball, do not be afraid to politely decline if you are not confident that you can manage that dance. Don't feel pressured if the MC is calling for "one more couple".

#### **Forming Sets:**

- Form sets when the dance is announced, or when the band signals the next dance by playing the opening bars of music
- When the dance is announced or introductory music is played, *walk* onto the floor with your partner.
- Always join sets from the bottom, never dash into the middle or the top of a set that has already formed.
- If you are the top couple, it is customary to count off the couples so each dancer knows if they are first couple, second couple, etc. If after counting off the sets you find that more couples are needed to complete the set, hold up fingers indicating how many couples are needed. The teacher or MC will usually announce it.

#### **More Survival Tips:**

- Be aware of and open to cues your partner and the other members of the set may be giving you as you do the dance. A good partner will try to help you through a dance and remind you what comes next in a subtle way.
- If you mess up, which most people do during the evening, however experienced, don't panic! Sort out the set so that you can all dance the next time through.

#### In Memoriam : KATHLEEN ( Katie) DUNN 1924-2022

We mourn the passing of Katie Dunn who, with husband Gerry, was for many years a leading light on the Victoria dance scene.

In 1973 they helped form the Victoria Branch of the RSCDS which soon established itself as one of the chief focal points of SCD in the area

Katie and Gerry were already prominent in the local ballroom dance world and Gerry was teaching a regular folk dance class at the YMCA. This system of cross pollination allowed them to persuade many dancers to give SCD a try.



In 1975 Miss Milligan arrived in town to conduct the teacher candidate exams. Miss Milligan declined hotel accommodation and Katie put her up at their house on Rockland Ave.(see picture below)



By this time Miss Milligan was too elderly to dance the night away and so they sat up and talked the night away: and argued. Both women were, shall we say, of determined character and notably disinclined to give way in an argument. Katie always said that in her experience, Miss Milligan was sometimes overly hasty in judging a candidate. But occasionally Katie Dunn out -wrangled Jean Milligan, and Miss Milligan was persuaded to reconsider. If you were in a tight corner Katie Dunn was the one to have on your side. Katie undoubtedly possessed an obstinate streak and was no stranger to controversy. If the conversation became too enthusiastic as to the many virtues of Scottish Country Dance she would happily interject that it all came from Ireland anyway. And then sit back and enjoy the general consternation.

Although music and dance were the breath of life to Katie, her teaching style was methodical: very calm and deliberate. At that time it wasn't the custom to continually brief dances so they had to be mastered in class

In practice she often left teaching chores to Gerry because her real forte was organizing the Social Weekends to which she brought a remarkable combination of vigour and glamour. The splendid Leprechaun Frolic of 1978 was one perfect example. (see March 2021 newsletter).

In later years ,she continued to work for VISCDS acting on our Ball Committee and representing the club on the Joint Scottish Council to which she brought an unrivalled knowledge of the local dance scene.

This brief glimpse into Katie's world might conclude that she possessed a generous nature combined with an indomitable spirit. Perhaps these were, in fact, among the chief characteristics of her whole generation-a generation now, alas, passing from us.
